

He was the son of Mr and Mrs John Abe, and was b Nov 27, 1855 in Germany; m Miss Caroline Brasch in 1877, and in 1888 they came to America to make their farm home in Green Lake county; after res. there for 18 yrs, they moved to a farm near Ripon, where Mrs Abe d in 1915. He res. thereafter with his ch. He had been a member of the Eman. Evang. Ch since coming to this country. Death occurred at the farm home of Mr and Mrs Otto H Martin, two miles east of the city, in July, 1932, survived by 9 ch.: Rev Wm Abe, of Waumandee, Wis.; Henry, Ripon twp; August and Frank, Milwaukee; Mrs Ida Martin, Mrs Anna Sauerbreit and Mrs Louise Zimdars of Ripon twp; Mrs Fred Buchholz, Fond du Lac; and Mrs Minnie Heiden, Milwaukee. He was b in Wahrlie, Germany, Oct 22, 1885, son of the late Wm & Caroline Braasch Abe, and came with them to America in 1889, settling in Green Lake twp; Sept 5, 1912 he m Miss Amanda Lehman and they made their home on a farm, retiring to the city two yrs ago. Had been town assessor for 6 yrs, and was a member of Immanuel Evang Ch and served as trustee many yrs. Had been substitute mail carrier for 20 yrs on R #1; survived by his widow, and a dau Ora of this city, also by 3 bro: August, Frank, both of Milwaukee, and Rev Wm Abe of Monticello, and three sisters: Mrs Frieda Buchholz, Milwaukee; Mrs Ida Martin and Mrs Louise Zimdars of this city. A son Glen died before him and also two sisters and one brother. Inter in Woodlawn Rev Theo Jordan offic.
